### Safety Message / Expanded Safety Message, Safety Plan, Site Safety Plan:

Make sure doctors, nurses, etc who are treating people with the coronavirus have proper PPE

- Surgical N95 respirator, FFP2 respirator, P100 or higher rated respirator with eye protection
- Face masks are an acceptable alternative until the supply chain is restored. Respirators should be prioritized for procedures that are likely to generate respiratory aerosols, which would pose the highest exposure risk to HCP.
- Eye protection, gown, and gloves continue to be recommended.
- If there are shortages of gowns, they should be prioritized for aerosol-generating procedures, care activities where splashes and sprays are anticipated, and high-contact patient care activities that provide opportunities for transfer of pathogens to the hands and clothing of HCP.
- When the supply chain is restored, fit-tested EMS clinicians should return to use of respirators for patients with known or suspected COVID-19.
- Eye protection should be face shield (fully covers front and side of face) or goggles (Surgical masks with plastic eye lenses are not appropriate PPE)
- Use a clean, non-sterile, long-sleeved, fluid-resistant gown
- Separate infected from other residents until 24 hours after the respiratory illness symptoms are gone
- BVMs and other ventilatory equipment should be equipped with HEPA filtration to filter expired



### -Security Message)

Security needs to be tight and kept up daily. Every person must have a way to contact any security officer incase of any suspicious people(s). The public knowing that there are government workers on base may cause more of a threat.

### -Gillette, Wyoming)

There is no updated annual report so this information is based on 2013.

The main issue of the Gillette community is drug crimes, theft and traffic safety. 98% of citizens are pleased with the speed their call is taken care of. 95% were pleased with how fast an officer responded to their call. Drug crimes have gone up over the years but traffic incidents have declined. As of today the main issues of Gillette are drugs and theft.

### Again, no updated crime reports

As of September 4-11 (weekly report), between that time, there were

- 2 domestic violence arrests
  - 4 theft reports (2 arrests)
  - 4 assault reports (4 arrests)
  - 1 poaching arrest
  - 2 DUI arrests
  - 1 shoplifting arrest
  - 2 vandalism reports
  - 3 drug involved arrests

There is a 1 in 570 chance that a person can become a victim of a crime in Gillette. (Per 1000 people) Gillette, WY has fewer crimes than MIddletown, CT. Middletown reports up to 34-42% more crimes annually, than Gillette. Population size in Gillette is approximately 32,000 and Middletown has approximately 47000

### Sex Offenders:

According to the 2019 Wyoming Sex Offender Registry Annual Report, Campbell county had a total number of 223 registered sex offenders living in the county at the end of the year 2019. This number was up from the year before when Campbell county had 203 registered sex offenders living there. Cambpell county is home to the fourth largest registered sex offender population in the state of Wyoming.

### Arrests

According to the county 17 website, Gillette has had 61 arrests over the past two weeks. This number may fluctuate due to some cases being marked as unidentified. The worst crime committed over the past two weeks in Gillette was on November 11 when Brennan Baker was charged with a string of crimes including assault and battery, identity theft, Unlawful possession-meth or Schedule 1 or 2 narcotic. If convicted there is a chance Baker may be sentenced to prison time. The most serious crime committed over the past month in Gillette was on November 10 when Holly Cruz was charged with Unlawful possession-plant from less than 3 ounces, expired registration, DWUI alcohol and controlled substance, unlawful possession-powder or crystalline form less than 3 grams. If convicted of these offenses Cruz may be charged with multiple felonies.

### **Schools**

- The schools in Campbell County are still open. If a student has gotten a case or has been in contact with a person who has been diagnosed they are to contact a health care provider and the school is sending everyone home for 2-5 days. This is active to let the school get a deep clean in the classrooms that the student(s) were in.
- As of now there are no records of Wyoming schools being closed due to covid-19 since they reopened for the start of the year in August 25th 2020

### Travel

- The greatest population of Wyomingites live in either Campbell or Laramie county.
- At this time there are no travel restrictions for this state. There have been mask orders for Albany, Carbon, Converse, Goshen, Hot Springs, Laramie, Lincoln, Natrona, Park, Sheridan, Sublette, Sweetwater, Teton, washakie county. Wind River Reservation also has no travel restrictions.
- The counties that have not been ordered or approved are Big Horn, Campbell, Crook, Fremont, Johnson, Niobrara, Platte, Uinta, and Weston.

### **Sports**

- Per order of the Wyoming High School Activities Association (WHSAA) all fall sports will start on time as of 7/28/2020. As of 11/16/2020 both wrestling and basketball are continuing their seasons. Both sports have rules and regulations to allow them to keep practicing. They have rules on each team bringing their own medkits and other necessary items. Wrestling should be constantly cleaning and making sure face coverings are on at all times. The WHSAA encourages basketball players to not lick their hands then wipe their shoes. Also safe practices are required, each player should have a face covering and their own personal hygiene and hydration.

### **Stores**

- Kum & Go convenience store and gas station located at 310 Skyline Dr, Gillette, WY 82716 and is open 24hrs, is a 2 minute drive from CCMH and has food and gas priced at \$2.21 regular, \$2.43 premium, and \$2.25 for diesel. \*(these prices are over 24hrs old and may have changed)\* The busiest time is around 3pm or 4pm A contact number is: +13076863703
- Walmart supercenter located on 2300 S Douglas Hwy, Gillette, WY 82718 and is open from 7AM-11PM and is a 5 minute drive from the CCMH. A contact number is:+13076821103
- Smith's Food and Drug is another store that people can use to get information and to run in and grab some supplies. Also, the store has a pharmacy so if you need last minute medical supplies that the hospital is running out on you can probably get it here. The address is: 906 Camel Dr, Gillette, WY 82716 a contact number is: +13076821103. The store is a 7-8 minute drive from the hospital.
- The stores have encouraged people to follow the CDC guidelines and they encourage the employees to make sure crowding does not happen and they encourage everyone to try and keep the stores clean and hygienic.

### Restaurants

- In the state of Wyoming restaurants are limited to wearing a mask at all times they are limited to the amount of people at a tabe no more than 8 unless they are in the same household. Before and after handling menus and money have to sanitize. The employees have to do a screening before shifts. Disposable menus not required
  - All customers must be 6 feet away from each other while waiting and sitting at a table.
- All self-serve restaurants will only be opened if the rood is pre packaged and the drinks are refilled in a different container.
- All employees must be wearing a face covering, gloves, and must sanitize before they open, after they close and during the day.

### Activities (recreational activities, etc.)

- If physical distancing measures are employed, gatherings for indoor events are limited to 25% of venue capacity with a maximum of 100 people. Gatherings for outdoor events are limited to 50% of venue capacity with a maximum of 250 people.
- Faith-based gatherings are exempt from the rule. This includes church, funerals, parades, and other business get-togethers.



- Playgrounds at businesses shall remain closed
- Dance and karaoke will not happen and the business should place some sort of sign stating that if you show or have any symptoms you can not enter.
- Gyms shall remain open on a limited plan. Employees shall remain 6 ft away from customers and all equipment must be wiped down. Hand sanitizer and hand wash will be available. Group classes will be limited to 25 people with equipment being at least 6 ft apiary.(preferably 10 feet). The pool and gym will be open only if there is 1 person per 120 square feet. Each person should get their own 10x12 square to do work.

### About the virus:

- The symptoms of the virus are coughing, high fevers, and shortness of breath.
- The symptoms can take 2-14 days to show up.
- Keep a 6ft radius of any person showing symptoms of COVID-19
- The virus spreads by person to person contact
- The virus can live on a surface for up to 9 days
- The virus seems to spread through communities the fastest. (CDC)
- Viability may last for hours or days on surfaces, current evidence suggests

### There is a vaccine being created; so the CDC recommends:

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.
- Avoid touching deceased bodies that have currently died due to COVID-19
  - This is a precaution due to lack of knowledge on the spread of the virus (CDC)

### How to stay safe and prevent the spread of the virus:

- 1. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- 2. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.



- 3. For disinfection, alcohol solutions with at least 70% alcohol or <u>any common EPA- registered</u> <u>disinfectants</u>
- 4. Wear a mask and practice social distancing of at least 6 feet

### Mission Activities and/or Summary for the Operational Period:

Wyoming Covid-19 cases have surged over the past week with 26,169 people infected and 155 deaths as of 11/20/2020; There are an additional 3,406 probable cases. Hospitals are overwhelmed and do not have resources. Emergency teams have been deployed to two medical centers to help (Cheyenne Medical Center and Gillette Hospital).

The state currently has requested and approved a mask mandate in place in several counties, which being: Teton County, Laramie County, Albany County, Natrona County, Sweetwater County, Sheridan County, Park County, Lincoln County, Choshen County, Sublette County, Hot springs County, Carbon County, Washakie County, and Uinta County.

There are several Covid hotspot counties including Natrona County, Laramie County, Albany County, Fremont County, and Campbell County.

In 2019, Wyoming's population was at 578,789 people, which makes this state the least populated in the country.
