




<p>Safety Message / Expanded Safety Message, Safety Plan, Site Safety Plan: <u>Make sure doctors, nurses, etc who are treating people with the coronavirus have proper PPE</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Surgical N95 respirator, FFP2 respirator, P100 or higher rated respirator with eye protection Face masks are an acceptable alternative until the supply chain is restored. Respirators should be prioritized for procedures that are likely to generate respiratory aerosols, which would pose the highest exposure risk to HCP. Eye protection, gown, and gloves continue to be recommended. If there are shortages of gowns, they should be prioritized for aerosol-generating procedures, care activities where splashes and sprays are anticipated, and high-contact patient care activities that provide opportunities for transfer of pathogens to the hands and clothing of HCP. When the supply chain is restored, fit-tested EMS clinicians should return to use of respirators for patients with known or suspected COVID-19. If you're feeling sick, you should make an appointment with your doctor VIA phone call ASAP.
To ensure the safety of others and limit virus spread, **DO NOT** show up at the doctor's office, they will come to you.

Generally, supermarkets have been upping sanitizing and disinfecting procedures, both in how often and the effectiveness. Stores with pickup/delivery options suggest this for at-risk customers. Sampling as well as refilling of reusable/personal cups from stores has been suspended. Item limits have been placed on high demand items- cleaning products, non-perishable foods, toilet paper, ect- or stores have asked customers to be considerate of others' need for these items. Sanitizing wipes or pumps have been placed at the cashiers and entrances of many stores too. Many companies have communications with CDC to take guidance as infection numbers increase.

As of March 17th Amazon only accepts shipments of medical supplies, disinfectants, and household staples as well as other high-demand products while temporarily disabling shipment creations for products other than these until April 5th. Amazon hopes to "more quickly receive, restock, and ship these products to customers."

Travel Restrictions:

Passengers who have transited or have been in Austria, Belgium, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Iran, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, or Switzerland in the past 14 days are not allowed to enter the USA.
Passengers to China (People's Rep.), Ireland (Rep.) or in the United Kingdom (excluding overseas territories outside of Europe in the past 14 days are also not allowed to enter the country.

Non-Peer Reviewed Facts:

Mean time illness onset to hospital admission was estimated at 3–4 days.
Mean time from hospital admission to death was 8.8 days.
Median time delay of 13 days from illness onset to death.
Average time delay from illness onset to hospital admission is approximately 7 days.
Deceased cases were more predominantly male (70%) and older (85% were 60 years of age or older).
The time from the illness onset to death is also comparable to SARS.
The living cases include persons who were isolated, while all deceased cases were admitted for treatment.

SARS-nCoV-2 is the seventh member of the coronaviruses that infects humans, MERS and SARS being two of the latest to affect the world.

Little is known of reinfection for SARS and MERS, but more important for these viruses is how long immunity lasts in the body after infection and immunity in SARS and MERS lasts about a year or two for both.

To date, unknown if zoonosis is still taking place, or strictly human-to-human, other coronaviruses circulate among civet cats and bats, among other animals.
